Why is learning languages important?

Learning a foreign language provides an opening to other cultures. A high-quality language education should foster pupils' curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world. The teaching should enable pupils to express their ideas and thoughts in another language and to understand and respond to its speakers, both in speech and in writing. It should also provide opportunities for them to communicate in new ways.

Language teaching should provide the foundation for learning further languages, equipping pupils to study further at high school.

Our aims are to provide a practical and engaging approach to modern foreign languages, demonstrating the variety of skills needed to be successful linguists. Learning a foreign language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for our pupils. It helps them to further develop their communication skills (including the key skills of speaking and listening).

- Can write at varying length, for different purposes and audiences, using the variety of grammatical structures that they have learnt
- Discover and develop an appreciation of a range of writing in the language studied.
