English


In our writing this half term will complete our unit of work writing an information text about witches, write a story based on a cumulative tale from Africa and use direct language in our instruction writing. We follow the Talk for Writing model so the children have lots of opportunities to rehearse what they will write.

Phonics / Reading – our daily phonics sessions will continue revisiting and teaching using the Read Write Inc approach, as well as No Nonsense Spellings to develop understanding of spelling rules, with spelling tests on a **Friday**. Please ensure reading books are in school **every day** so books can be changed as frequently as is necessary. We will be visiting the school library on **Tuesday** afternoons to change our books.

In our whole class reading sessions we will be reading a range of stories, information books and poems to expand and extend our reading skills and confidence. We love reading and read books across the curriculum to support our understanding of other subjects. Our class novels this term are Flat Stanley, Peanut Jones and The Truth Pixie. <u>Science</u>


We will be exploring materials, their uses and why some are chosen for certain purposes. We will explore their properties and uses in our everyday life.

<u>Maths</u>

We will be exploring multiplication and division. We will learn to multiply and divide by 2, 5 and 10 and take part in TTRockstars competitions to develop our understanding. We will also explore shape, fractions and statistics, applying our knowledge to solving problems.

Global Citizenship

Our theme this term is **Social Justice & Equity and Human Rights** with a focus on challenging discrimination. For our social action project will host an afternoon tea event for those who work in our NHS to say thank you raising awareness of nursing



Geography

We will be finding out about the weather. Why the weather is different in different parts of the world and look at climate.

<u>RE</u>

We will be exploring the religion of Judaism, how it came to be, the creation story and significant celebrations. We will look at how celebrations across religions bring people together.

PSHE / RSE

We will explore the question – How can a positive mindset help you? We will discuss our emotions and how we can remain positive even when situations around us make us feel sad.

<u>History</u>

We will be finding out about pioneers in nursing and their impact on nursing today. We will learn about Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Norfolk born nurse Edith Cavell. We will visit Bridewell Museum in Norwich to see artefacts and meet historians.

<u>German – Miss Elgar</u>

Each week the children will have the opportunity to expand their German words and be able to answer simple questions about their family, counting to 10, how to say hello and much more.

Music – Mrs Freestone

The Suffolk Music Service will continue to visit weekly. Mrs Freestone will lead the children in their exploration of musical dimensions, pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, and structure.
