
Message from Mr Huxtable—Willow Class

We have had a fantastic week in Willow Class. The children have been practicing their use of formal language and have enjoyed examining several quality written examples. We thought about the purpose of a letter and why we would change our use of language depending on the audience.

Maths has been very exciting this week. There has been plenty of investigations into fractions of amount and the differences and similarities between fractions of amount and fractions of shapes. Our next challenge is to see if we can observe fractions in the real world. It would be fantastic if we could have photos of real world fractions in the classroom! These can either emailed to myself or printed off to bring into class. For example, how could the following be described as a fraction:



Finally, we had a fantastic visit from the dentist. The children were wonderful welcoming visitors into the school and full of fantastic questions on how to keep their teeth healthy!



An eventful week for Chestnut class this week!

In English we have been focused on Essays. We have read a range - some that were really good and others that needed improving! We had the task of analysing them and then offering suggestions as to how make them of a standard that is acceptable for Upper Key Stage 2!

We have also started to develop our own writing - using the PEE strategy!

First we make a POINT about the topic

Second we provide EVIDENCE to support our point

Finally we add more detail with an EXPLANATION

In Geography we studied the Civil Rights Movement and how this originated and progressed throughout time. It certainly made us think about the inequalities that people have faced in the world.

As part of our work on being Healthy we considered the role of Screen time and how it impacts our lives. We created play scripts between a parent and child - building links from our English work to our PSHE work. This lesson was enjoyable and made us all think how there are so many factors that affect both our Physical and Mental Health!
