## Message from Miss Danks Continued—Acorn Class


We would like to say a massive thank you to the gardening club and Ellyn for the Acorns front area, they loved it and we found loads of ladybird larvae to observe!

(I feel contacting him again may be stalking so I think we will just leave it there.)




