Message from Mrs Tilley

In Hazel class this week, we have been extremely busy. We have started our new Maths topic of measurement and have been focusing on weight and what is heavier and what is the lightest. Our drawing club book is Mrs Armitage on wheels and the children have enjoyed creating their own bike and adding lots of imaginative extras to them.

In the afternoons we looked at plants and how to grow them. This week we have started planting our own seeds and keeping a diary to record the different stages of a plant life cycle.

In our continuous provision we have been looking at floating and sinking and finding out how many buttons it takes to make a floating boat sink.

Juniper class have settled into the term beautifully and have been working hard whilst demonstrating great learning attitudes. We have a new focus book, 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl and the class have had a lot of fun making predictions of what powers the magic finger might have. The children have written persuasive letters to get the Gregg family to stop hunting and have explored synonyms for the word 'angry'. Our Maths work has been themed towards money, so we have been using our knowledge of the 2-, 5- and 10-times table to help us when counting in jumps of the coin's values.





Message from Miss Danks – Acorns Class

What a wonderful start we have had to the beginning of the summer term! The weather is treating us well and we have been lucky enough to make the most of exploring our outdoor area, spotting all the wonders of spring!

The children absolutely loved the new library so a massive thank you to everyone in the PTA who worked so hard to make it an exciting learning space. We share stories and change our library and reading books on a Monday so please make sure bookbags are in every Monday'.

This week in Maths we are exploring shape! We have begun learning about 3D shapes and have tried spotting them in our learning environment. we have discussed the properties of shape and have made up fun games to test each others' knowledge. Next time you are out and about see what 3D shapes you can find!

In Talk for writing we have decided to use a non-fiction book! We have been very excited to start learning about dinosaurs and have begun learning all about a very special woman called Mary Anning; ask your children all about her and see what interesting facts they can remember!

Lastly everyone has been working hard on our mini allotment plot to get it ready for plants. We have commandeered a shelf that was being skipped, removed the wheels, painted it and filled it with soil so we are ready to fill it with plants. The children are very proud of how they are learning how to reuse items and materials rather than putting them in the bin and are very proud of all of their hard work making their recycled allotment! We are very excited for our walk to the garden centre to buy some fruit and veg for it!



Message from Mrs Bramwell

In Oak Class we have had a great first week back at school making the most of our outdoor space. We have been exploring microhabitats in the front garden and the creatures that live in them. There were quite a few wriggly worms under the tyres as well as some speedy ants! We also spent our PE lesson learning about how to run effectively on the running track which has been recently painted on the field. We made sure we looked where we were running, ran on the balls of our feet and pumped our arms. We had such a lot of fun and everyone really tried hard especially as we were running around the whole track.

In Maths we have started a unit of learning about fractions. We have been using shapes and amounts to find a half and on Wednesday we used cubes to find a quarter of an amount.

Players rolled a dice to select a verb and the type of adverbial. They then worked together to compose a sentence using the verb and adverbial whilst also adding extra detail. The children wrote many sentences then chose their favourite to write in their book.


Message from Chestnut Class
